This term HVPS will be involved in the Koala Smart program. Koala Smart is a Lions project and an educational and creative arts program for schools in specific areas where Koalas are known to exist and where growth in a healthy koala population has been possible because of a valuable genetic diversity. It aims to inspire, motivate and educate primary and secondary school children, along with the local community, to actively participate and embrace change to save our koalas.

Significant research and data collected has delivered some disturbing predictions. Most notably, if current urban growth practices continue, koalas will become extinct in the next 35 years. It is believed that a significant step in preventing this catastrophe is education – at all levels of the community.

Over the course of the 2019 school calendar year, students will be asked to prepare a visual and written response to the question “What would you do to save the koala?”

The school entries will be evaluated and a winning entry from both Primary and Secondary schools will each receive a full-size Hello Koalas sculpture painted in their school colours.

Hannam Vale PS will also receive a half-metre Hello Koalas sculpture that students will be asked to design a theme for and paint. All schools’ sculptures will then be put on public display to showcase the creative work of local students. The public will also be invited to vote on their favourites at the public displays – the People’s Choice.



Woolworths Earn and Learn

Hannam Vale Public School will be participating in the Woolworths Earn and Learn promotion. This promotion runs from the 1st May until the 25th June, 2019. A customer will receive a sticker for every \$10 spent in a single transaction at any Woolworths Supermarket, Woolworths Metro and Woolworths Online.
